The Gazebo is a beautiful addition to the Kitchen Garden and allows lessons in all weather. We were fortunate to win a Schools Upgrade Funding grant and grateful to BPS parent, Dan Johnston, for his hard work building it for us.

Next week we will have a new and improved cricket pitch installed on the oval. We worked in collaboration with Bridgewater Cricket Club to apply for, and win, a \$20k grant from SACA to build the new pitch. This benefits us with a great new place to play at lunchtimes and, best of all, opens up new opportunities for the Bridgewater Cricket Club to have more junior teams playing in the local competition!

ROAD SAFETY

Another year and the same old problems with parking at pick up and drop offs! We continue to explore many options for easing the difficulties which arise with our unique road layout here at BPS. We dream of a 'kiss and drop'! In the past (10 years+) we've discussed with DfE, Council, State Government and at Governing Council about options to make things better. For a number of reasons we have to live with the set-up we have for now. We continue to explore alternatives, in the meantime, we ask that consideration be given to the following:

- Drive safely at all times around the school
- Don't park on the top court
- Don't use our neighbour's driveway for parking or drop offs
- Get out and help your child/ren cross the road to your parked car
- Teach, model and practice safe crossing with your child if they walk to Coles, especially around the crossing point near the CFS
- Did you know there is more parking near the gym and oval?
 This is a great spot to meet older students who can safely walk there after school.

OSHC

Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) is available before school, after school and on Pupil Free Days. Bookings are essential, and can be made via the Camp Australia website. Click <u>here</u> to register or to book in.

If you need to drop kids off at school before 8.30am, you will need to make a booking at OSHC.

Our duty teacher begins supervising children from 8.30am. If we have students on site prior to that we may choose to take them to OSHC and parents will be billed accordingly.
