NAPLAN

Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students across Australia will take part in the NAPLAN tests next week. The purpose of this testing is to identify areas of strength and areas for improvement, both at an individual student level and at a school-wide level. By understanding your child's performance in these key areas, we can better support their learning and growth.

Bridgewater PS does very well in NAPLAN testing and we are proud of our results. However, most of what we do and learn at school is not assessed in NAPLAN. Bridgewater PS Teachers provide learning opportunities in a wide range of different areas to grow academically and as good humans. NAPLAN assesses just two aspects of education, on one day, twice, during their primary school journey. We like to think of it as taking a screenshot of a movie; whilst there is something to see, it is not the whole story of your child at school.

Literacy and Numeracy are core learning areas and we work extremely hard to teach them. NAPLAN gives us some good information to better meet the needs of our students. Bridgey also values the Arts, PE, Play, STEM, Drama, Music, Cooking and Gardening, Social Skills and Conflict Resolution, creativity and being active democratic school citizens. We value and see in our students their kindness, resilience, humour, fairness, inquisitiveness, curiosity and love of books, nature, culture and fun.

My role is to work with teachers whenever needed to ensure that all of our children are given every possible opportunity to succeed and learn in a safe and happy environment.
