Our unique layout has always created challenges for a smooth and problem-free pick up and we all endeavour to make this as safe, easy and efficient as possible. One piece of feedback we have had is about parking on the road to the gym which causes difficulties in the flow of traffic heading down, turning at the oval and coming back up. It is a small inconvenience, but an area where improvements could be made. We will monitor this and ask that you be mindful of this challenge too; we are open to suggestions on how to better manage this.

Student Parliament

It has been a busy time for Student Parliament, they've been quietly going about their work and have achieved a lot.





The CFS visit was a big hit with the kids (who doesn't like fire trucks!) and this was an election promise of the Deputy PM. Ella, our Deputy, was defeated in the PM vote, but PM Annalise supported her in delivering

the promise. This is a great illustration of how our Student Parliament works together and considers all voices and ideas. Maybe our Parliaments in Adelaide and Canberra could learn a thing or two from our kids?

A big priority of Student Parliament and our Prime Minister has been to reinvent some spaces in the playground. They have voted to paint more handball courts (this will happen when we get a spell of dry weather) and to improve the soccer goals on the top court (you would have noticed these at pick up time). But the biggest redesigns have been their ideas for the old Birdsnest area and the fenced areas next to it. We have purchased a large outdoor seating and table set to go in the fenced area to provide a calm place to read or draw at break times. The old Birdsnest area is to be transformed into a nature craft space where kids can dig, crush rocks (a Bridgey tradition!), build with sticks and have mud! The new soccer goals are super popular but Studio meetings and Student Parliament noticed that they were being used by the same people every day. They discussed the problem and agreed that equity of access was important. They had many ideas to solve the problem and decided to trial three different rosters over three weeks and discuss which is best at the next meeting.

Studios also raised the problem of not enough sports balls to use at break times. The students said they aren't looked after well enough so instead of asking for the school to buy more, they decided to ask for donations of old, unused balls from home. Many kids said they have balls sitting around unused at home and so a letter went out to start collecting these. Interestingly, they have reported the donated balls are looked after better than the ones the school bought in the past.

The kids also voted to have a movie for the whole school at the end of each term. They realised this would have to be agreed to by the Senate / Teachers, so it was taken to Staff Meeting and the teachers agreed for this to happen. So, the idea is for Daggy Day to be on the Thursday and then Friday will be a dress in comfy casuals and watch a movie with snacks. Sound like a great way to celebrate the end of term!




Paralympics


